## OUR MISSION STATEMENT

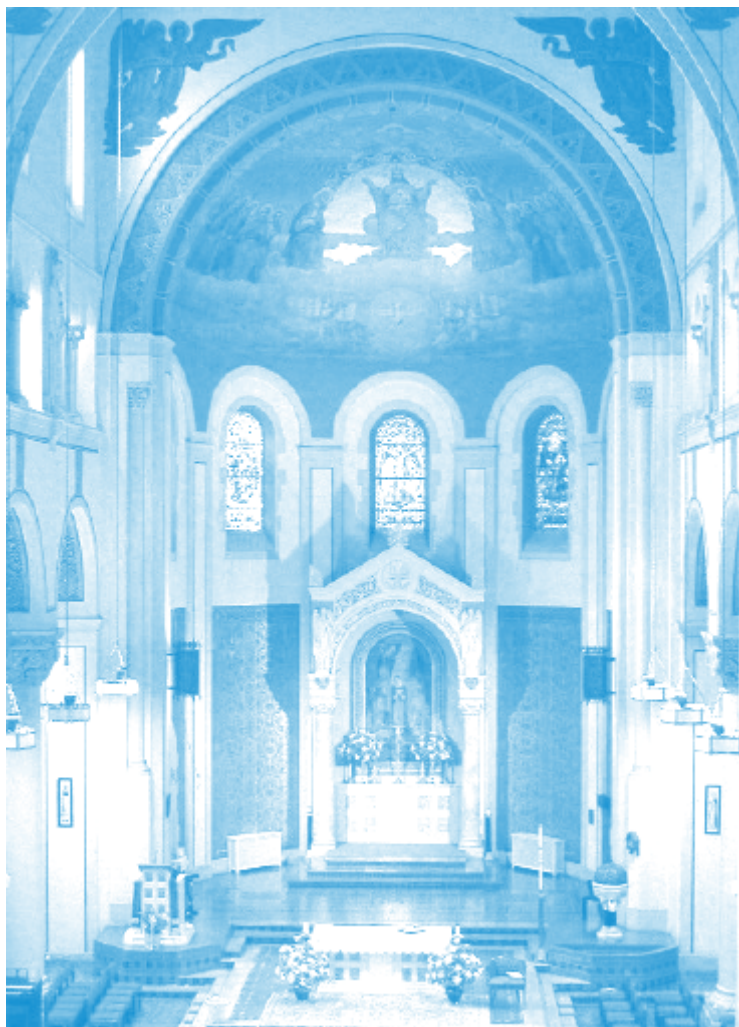
